Answers to Questions About Water Department Billing

I want to address the confusion with the Water Department's billing process. The Board and I regret any stress and misunderstandings it may have caused.

Many residents have been receiving ESTIMATED bills, rather than ACTUAL readings, while the Water Department works to replace transponders in the meters.

The transponders inside the water meters only have a working life of approximately 15 years. Water usage is recorded in the meter head and transmitted to the Village.

The Village has been upgrading the meters, replacing the transponders, since 2019; upgrading over 2600 transponders. This effort stopped during COVID as workers were not allowed to enter homes. After the pandemic, parts were not immediately available.

When the transponder stops working, the meter head is no longer able to transmit your ACTUAL water use, so an ESTIMATE is being charged for your use. The new transponder calculates the ACTUAL usage back to the date when the meter went into estimating mode. Estimated rates are calculated at the lowest rate charged since the meter went into estimate mode.

That is why some people received an unusually high bill after the new transponders were installed and others have received reimbursements from the Village. Please know that if you received an unusually high ADJUSTED bill, this is not going to be your monthly bill going forward.

If your bill still states ESTIMATED, do not delay in contacting the Village. Please call (847) 671-8252 or email ekubkowski@vofp.com to make an appointment to upgrade your meter's responder or to schedule a meeting to determine adjustments, payment plans, and/ or reimbursements.

We have added weekend and evening appointments for your convenience. We also have staff that can assist in Spanish and in Polish.

I have requested that the water department staff review each and every claim or inquiry received and get back to you as soon as possible.

Going forward, I urge you to sign up for the Water Smart Program. The Water Smart Program shows your hourly and historical water usage and provides leak notices. Complete information is available on our website. We will continue to distribute more information and background on this issue on our website and our Facebook page. We appreciate the opportunity to answer your questions and to help you through this transition.



To avoid unusually high-water bills, check to make sure that your faucets and toilets are not leaking or running and that they are in good operating condition. If you suspect there is a leak somewhere in your home and you need help locating it, schedule an appointment with the Village's Water Department, by emailing ekubkowski@ vofp.com with your name, address, and phone number. Also, check the top of your water bill for the type of reading you received. If your bill states ESTIMATED, please call (847) 671-8252 to schedule an appointment to obtain an accurate reading.
