### **We Need Your Help to Deter Rodents**

The Village of Franklin Park has been working to deter rodent activity and has retained Orkin to set and regularly maintain more bait boxes throughout town. The Village has recently doubled the number of bait boxes in alleys, now totaling nearly 800. DO NOT MOVE BAIT BOXES OR PUT THEM IN YOUR YARDS - ONLY ORKIN TECHNICIANS SHOULD HANDLE BAIT BOXES.

The problem cannot be solved without your help - Please eliminate sources of food and hiding places on and around your property.





Garbage bins should always be closed with lids securely fastened to prevent critters from reaching a food source. Keep the area around your garbage bins free of trash, food scraps and spills.



Dog waste is a food supply for rodents so please clean up after your pet while on walks and in your own backyard immediately.



Do not feed wildlife - rats are attracted to food left out for birds and squirrels. Do not leave pet food or water bowls outside.



Mow your lawn on a regular basis and eliminate weeds in alleys and areas behind homes. Overgrown lawns and weeds are breeding grounds for rodents and insects.



Pick ripe fruits and vegetables in your garden right away to eliminate a food source for pests and insects.

If you are disabled or elderly and need assistance complying, call (847) 671-4800. If you see properties that need to be maintained, please call the Village. **Residents can rent an additional trash bin for \$3.66 per month. Call (847) 671-8258.** 

#### The Village is issuing tickets to:

- Properties where trash is overflowing, on the ground, and not in closed containers
- Pet owners who do not clean up after their pets
- Property owners who do not eliminate debris in yards
- Homeowners if grass is over six inches high

### Des Plaines River Trail Improvements -Connect With Nature

I am excited that Franklin Park will now have safer and more direct access to the Des Plaines River Trail with the completion of the new pedestrian trail bridge constructed over Lawrence Avenue.

In partnership with neighboring communities, West Central Municipal Conference, and the Forest Preserves of Cook County, grant funding was obtained, and construction was completed on three segments of the trail. Funding has also been secured for construction of Segment 4 from Lawrence Avenue to Irving Park Road.

The \$12.5-million investment project along the Des Plaines River Trail improved three segments, a 4.4-mile stretch from Lawrence Avenue to Touhy Avenue. Improvements and upgrades included:

- Installation of the pedestrian bridge over Lawrence Avenue
- Repair of unpaved trail surface
- Relocation of portions of this trail away from the river and out of the floodplain
- New boardwalk to raise the path in a section prone to flooding
- Signal and ADA improvements.
- New amenities include benches, lighting, and signage

Once completed, the Des Plaines River Trail Improvements project will become the keystone link in a network of trails that spans 50 + miles from the Wisconsin Border to North Avenue.

We are grateful to all our local Mayors and regional partners, especially Rosemont Mayor and State Representative Brad Stephens and to Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle for helping bring this tremendous project to fruition.

This is a wonderful enhancement that will support the health of our community. Take advantage of the nice weather and explore what the trail has to offer.

Visit our website to watch the video that highlights the trail upgrades and discusses how it helps to create a continuous trail network in Northeastern Illinois, connecting local communities with well-maintained trails that support low-stress biking, walking, kayaking, and horseback-riding.

While one used a fire extinguisher to break the car window, the others pulled the six-year-old boy from the car, saving his life as he escaped the flames.

This award is granted to any community member in recognition of an outstanding contribution to the Franklin Park Police Department, law enforcement, or public safety. Daniel Schoedel Jr., who was rescued, and his father, Daniel Schoedel, also attended the Board Meeting.

### Village Supports Electrical Aggregation Program

Letters were mailed to residents recently announcing the Village's support to continue with the electrical aggregation program that guarantees residents will pay the exact price equal to the ComEd rate for one year beginning in October 2024. In turn, the Village will create over 6,000,000 kWh of renewable energy, equal to removing the emissions of 595 gasoline powered vehicles driven for one year. This aggregation program was approved by Franklin Park voters in a 2012 referendum.

Several versions of the program announcement letter were mailed to different households, so please read your letter for specific information. Not all residents will be included in the program, so many of the letters will just be informational. While you may receive a different letter than your neighbor, you will not pay a rate that is one penny more than your neighbor's rate.

MC Squared Energy Services, LLC (mc2), was selected to serve eligible residents and small business customers with an electric supply price equal to the ComEd rate and you may opt out at any time with no termination fees. To opt in or out, email FranklinPark@mc2energyservice.com. If you have questions, call our consultant Adam Hoover at (224) 255-5135.

No one from ComEd, **MC Squared Energy Services**, or the Village will call or visit your home to ask you to enroll. If you are contacted and told that you must enroll, you may file a complaint with the Illinois Commerce Commission.
