Wyndham Garden Hotel Development is Nearing Completion

Construction of the highly anticipated Wyndham Garden Hotel, located at 2900 Mannheim Road, is on track for completion by summer 2025.

This project is part of the Village's ongoing effort to improve our choice of stores and provide a choice of hotels for tourists. The development will serve as an economic engine that provides jobs and services for residents. In addition, improved commercial areas attract new investments and create a strong and stable community.

The premier 100-room, 4-star hotel will feature an impressive array of amenities including a state-of-the-art fitness center, stylish lounge, breakfast and bar areas, modern business services, adjustable meeting spaces, and environmentally friendly enhancements such as permeable pavers, landscaped parking lot islands, and advanced stormwater management features.

Overhead Traffic Signal Planned in Response to Accidents

The Village insisted that the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) install a temporary overhead traffic signal at the intersection of Edgington Street and Belmont Avenue. Belmont Avenue is a state route, and the overhead light must be approved by the State. The action is in response to several serious crashes that have occurred at the intersection. Village staff have submitted preliminary plans to IDOT for review and hope to have the temporary traffic signal in place by summer 2025.

One of the leading causes of all accidents is distracted driving. Drivers should not be texting at any time. Please do not text and drive, you may save the life of a child.
