Fall road repairs

Village Road Projects

Franklin Park is continuing with road repairs going into this fall season with the long awaited resurfacing of 25th Avenue from Addison to Belmont Avenue following Labor Day; thanks to the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT). Another project being completed this fall involves reconstruction of Cherry Street from Birch Street to Maple Street. Additionally, Cherry Street will be milled and resurfaced from Maple Street to Elm Street. Birch Street improvements will include complete reconstruction between Chestnut Street and Cherry Street. This project will be funded with the Village's allocation of Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) funds and is scheduled for letting in 2009. These repairs are much needed and will be a welcome improvement to the Village roadways.

Low income energy program

Home Energy Assistance Program

Starting September 1st income eligible seniors may file for help with winter home heating bills through the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). Applications are being taken at Leyden Senior Services, 10001 Grand Avenue in Franklin Park.

Seniors must be 60 or older on the day of application. Also, they must bring the following documents in order to file for benefits: their Social Security card, a photo ID card, current NICOR bill, current COM ED bill, proof of gross income for 30 days, including their 2009 Social Security letter.

LIHEAP provides a one-time payment to the utility companies on behalf of the recipient.

In addition to seniors, LIHEAP is open to persons and/or households with disabled members who receive SSI and SSDI benefits.

Officer gives up his vacation time

Officer Volunteers to Repair Homes

Officer Norm Carli, a 19-year veteran of the Police Department spent his recent vacation time not relaxing on a beach, but volunteering his time to help fix homes for those less fortunate.

He took a trip to McCreary County located in southeastern Kentucky, in the heart of the Appalachian Mountains. This once was a thriving coal-mining region, in the 1900s the coal-mines closed down, and left those communities built by the coal mining industry without a source of income. Today, McCreary County is one of the poorest counties in the United States.

The idea for this trip did not come from Carli himself but rather from his two sons, Robert 19 and Kevin 17. They both went to a meeting at Oak Brook Community Church about a ministry in McCreary County called Hills and Hollers.

The cost of the trip was about \$225 per person; this did not include money for the building materials. He spread the word about the trip, and received donations from the Fraternal Order of Police in Franklin Park, as well as the

Franklin Park Fire Department, which they both donated \$250.

During the time Carli and his two sons spent in McCreary, they worked on a trailer home and addition by hanging drywall, insulating the walls, and replacing the old flooring and installing a metal roof on the trailer. They worked five days from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on the home.

After a week of volunteering his time, Officer Carli went back to being a police officer. Both Carli and his two sons would like to return to McCreary in the future to continue the work they started.
