The Village Needs You To Be Counted

Beginning in May 2010, Census Bureau enumerators will be dispatched to account for those who did not respond to the recent questionnaires. Their goal is to obtain a more accurate count of residents. If an enumerator approaches your home, please ask for their Census Bureau official identification. This identification does not have a photo, but it does identify the Census Bureau employee by name. If you would like further confirmation, each enumerator has a card with the phone number to the Palatine Census Bureau office, so you can call and confirm the individual's identity while they are at your door. The enumerator is not allowed to enter your home.

If you have already submitted your questionnaire, please inform the enumerator. If you have not, please grant a few minutes of your time so that you too can be counted.

The enumerators cannot ask any questions other than those listed on the questionnaire, and all information provided remains strictly confidential. The information that you give is for the Census Bureau only and cannot be shared with any other agency or individual.

Home Repair Fraud

The suspects cruise residential neighborhoods looking for elderly persons outside their home, or homes. The elderly persons are approached and an offer is made to do some sort of home repair work (driveway seal counting, tree trimming, roof repairs, chimney repairs, tuck pointing, etc.) The suspects are known to confuse the victim, by telling them they did not understand the original agreement, and any work done is substandard in nature. Crimes in these cases are usually committed by males of various ages working alone or in small groups, numbering two or three. These suspects will use pick up trucks, full sized vans, mini vans and passenger cars. The pick up trucks may have ladder racks, with ladders and spray-in device mounted in the bed.

Preventive Measure: Citizens have to be law enforcements eyes and report these activities. Any person(s) confronted by these subjects need to be aware that if the price sounds too good to be true then it is usually a repair fraud. Home owners that are approached by subjects that are highly interested into entering there homes need to be aware that this could possible be a Ruse Entry, and these subjects need to be refused entry and the Police notified as soon as possible. Any residences that are confronted with any suspicious person(s) or activity should contact the Franklin Park Police Department as soon as possible, by calling 911.
