Tax Appeal Workshop – July 9

As part of the triennial assessment process, the Northern Suburbs, including Franklin Park will be re-assessed this year. If you think that your new proposed assessed valuation is too high compared to similar properties in your area, you can file an appeal. The Assessor's Office will host a Workshop on July 9, from 6 to 8 PM at the Police Station to assist you. Bring a copy of your most recent tax bill. You can also file an appeal on line at cookcountyassessor.com by July 22.

The Village of Franklin Park and State Representative Camille Lilly will host a free shred event on Saturday, July 13 from 9 AM to Noon at the Police Station. Bring documents that contain your personally identifiable information and outdated medical records to be safely shredded.

The Village will also collect electronics for proper recycling. Go to vofp.com to see the complete list of items accepted. The Police Department will accept medications and prescription drugs to ensure safe disposal. Also, bring your outdated cell phones and chargers too!

This is a residential shredding only (no commercial shredding) event and shredding will be accepted until the shred truck reaches capacity.


Relay for Life – July 19

Take Precautions To Avoid West Nile Virus



Avoid the mosquito-borne West Nile Virus by limiting time outdoors especially at dawn and dusk. Wear long-sleeves, pants and socks, and use insect repellent with DEET, primarily applied to clothing. Eliminate breeding sites by cleaning gutters, storing containers upside down, covering trash containers to keep out rainwater. Empty birdbaths and wading pools every few days. Keep grass and weeds cut short and close screen doors tightly. Village inspectors are larviciding mosquito pools that are reported. Also, backyard catch basins can be treated by calling 847-671-8245.
