Transportation and Economic Vitality

Never has the linkage between transportation systems and economic vitality been more critical. We live in a world that demands on-time delivery and requires more dependence on truck movement than ever before. Population and economic growth are primarily occurring in metropolitan areas such as ours. If we cannot move goods to the marketplace and workers to the work place, our business communities cannot thrive. But that growing demand, coupled with rising fuel costs, is putting a strain on our local roads and transportation systems and that subsequently strains our economy.

Last month, I met with Victor Mendez, Administrator of the Federal Highway Administration in Washington DC, to address our transportation issues including finding federal support for local infrastructure repairs and restoration. As one of Illinois' largest industrial employers, I explained to Mr. Mendez how critical it is to Franklin Park's future that federal funding be directed to local level systems.

We must all work together to decrease congestion, increase mobility and enhance our economic competitiveness. We must continue to maintain our interstates and bridges. But local arterials that feed these systems must be repaired and restored. We want to continue to find ways to move truck traffic out of our neighborhoods, therefore requiring better access to our industrial parks from non-residential streets.

Working with our federal, state, and regional partners, Franklin Park will continue to find resources to fund our critical needs. We will continue to be innovative in our approach so that we can attract jobs and increase mobility for our businesses while protecting neighborhoods.

Just as we have been outspoken in our advocacy for completion of the Western Bypass and the utilization of high speed rail, we are equally committed to finding federal funding for our local roads and streets.

We owe that to you, our taxpayer.

Household Hazardous Waste

Household Hazardous waste can be dropped-off behind the Naperville Fire Station located at 1979 Brookdale Road, on Saturday and Sunday ONLY from 9AM to 2PM, excluding holidays. Household hazardous waste items are materials purchased for cleaning or maintaining a home. Business waste is not accepted. The facility is open and available to all residents of Illinois. Free Electronic Recycling Program

The Village has opened an E-Recycling site that is FREE to all Franklin Park residents, schools and businesses. Electronic items can be dropped off in the recycling container at 9360 Franklin Avenue (directly north of Franklin & Martens intersection), Monday through Friday, from 7AM to 3PM, excluding Village holidays.

Items accepted for recycling are monitors, laptops, TVs, computers, printers, cell phones, Pads, keyboards & mice, scanners, copiers, multifunction machines, FAX machines, MP3/iPod players, terminals (green screen), stereos, game consoles, phones, DVD & VCR players, electric typewriters, electric cash registers, microwave ovens, toaster ovens, curling irons, hair dryers, electronic tools.

When dropping off, please place your items inside the cardboard containers. Thank you!


