All such property shall be required to comply upon the sale or lease of any portion of the applicable zoning lot, or upon a change in the principal use of the applicable zoning lot. Walls and/or opaque fencing required hereunder shall consist of one or more of the following materials: masonry, brick, wood, composite panels or other opaque material as approved by the Zoning Administrator. The use of chain link, wire and plywood shall be prohibited.
- **Section 4.** All sections of the Franklin Park Zoning Ordinance not addressed in this Ordinance or another amending ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
  - Section 5. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held

invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.

- **Section 6.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

- Section 2. This Ordinance is and shall be designated as "The Annual Tax Levy Ordinance of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois for the Fiscal Year beginning May 1, 2016 and ending April 30, 2017."
- Section 3. The total amount of appropriations for all corporate purposes, legally made to be collected from the property tax levy of the current year is ascertained to be the sum of \$11,572,449.00.
- Section 4. The purpose of which appropriations are made and the amount appropriated for each purpose, respectively, to be collected for the Tax Levy of the current year are, as follows (see attached insert):

There is hereby certified to the County Clerk of Cook County, Illinois, the several sums aforesaid, constituting the total amount of \$11,572,449.00, which said total amount the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois requires to be raised by taxation for the current municipal fiscal year May 1, 2016 to April 30, 2017 of said Village, and the Village Clerk is hereby directed to file within the time required by law, a certified copy of this Ordinance and also to certify within said mentioned time to said County Clerk the total amount required to be raised by taxation; as aforesaid, in accordance with the provision of the revenue laws of the State of Illinois.
- Section 6. In the event that the Cook County Clerk is required to implement a Clerk's Reduction Factor in order to comply with the Property Tax Extension Limiting Law Limiting Rate, the County Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to apply such reduction to the tax levy for the Corporate Fund.
- Section 7. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.

#### ORDINANCE NUMBER 1617-Z-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN PARK, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, CONCURRING WITH THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS TO DENY A CONDITIONAL USE FOR A "CAR WASH" WITHIN THE C-3 GENERAL COMMERCIAL DISTRICT (ZBA 16-24: 9514 GRAND AVENUE)

WHEREAS, the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

WHEREAS, the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park (the "Corporate Authorities") have heretofore exercised the power conferred on them pursuant to Chapter 11-13-1, et seq., of the Illinois Municipal Code by adopting the Franklin Park Zoning Ordinance in 1974 (Ord. 7475 Z10), as amended from time to time; and

WHEREAS, a conditional use application, ZBA 16-24, has been submitted to the Village by Pawel Buch (the "Applicant") to allow within the C-3 General Commercial District the operation of a "Car wash" use (the "Proposed Conditional Use") on the property commonly known as 9514 Grand Avenue, Franklin Park, Illinois and as legally described on Exhibit A (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals held a public hearing on December 7, 2016 on whether the Proposed Conditional Use should be approved, at which time all persons present were afforded an opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, a public notice in the form required by law was given of said public hearing dates; and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals has filed its findings of fact and recommendations that the Proposed Conditional Use be denied, and the Corporate Authorities have duly considered said findings of fact and recommendations; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined, in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village, to concur with the recommendation of the Zoning Board of Appeals to deny the Proposed Conditional Use.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

- **Section 1.** The above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.
- Section 2. The President and the Board of Trustees hereby adopt by reference the findings of fact of the Zoning Board of Appeals as findings of the President and the Board of Trustees as if completely set forth herein. All documents and exhibits submitted at the aforesaid public hearings are also incorporated by reference into this Ordinance.
- **Section 3.** In addition to the findings set forth in Section 2 hereof, the President and the Board of Trustees further finds in relation to the Proposed Conditional Use as follows:
  - 1. The establishment, maintenance or operation of the Proposed Conditional Use will be detrimental to, or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort, or general welfare;
  - 2. The Proposed Conditional Use will be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, and will substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood;
  - 3. The Proposed Conditional Use will impede the normal and orderly development of the surrounding property for uses permitted in the C-3 General Commercial District;

- 4. The Proposed Conditional Use will affect the exterior architectural appeal and functional plan of structures already constructed as to cause a substantial depreciation in property values within the neighborhood;
- 5. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and necessary facilities for the Proposed Conditional Use are not in place at the Property; and
- 6. Ingress and egress for the Proposed Conditional Use shall negatively affect traffic congestion in the public streets.

**Section 4.** A Conditional Use is hereby denied for the operation of a "Car Wash" use in the C-3 General Commercial District located at 9514 Grand Avenue, Franklin Park, Illinois, and legally described as follows:

- **Section 5.** If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.
- **Section 6.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- Section 7. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect following its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
