2018 Grass Cutting Program

VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN PARK 2018 GRASS CUTTING PROGRAM CRITERIA AND REQUIREMENTS

QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. Applicant must be a resident of the Village and must be disabled or have a severe health problem and there is no one else in the household or family that can mow the lawn.
- 2. Each member within the applicant's household must obtain a medical verification note from their physician stating that they are unable to mow the lawn. Such verification shall remain on file at the Village Hall.

TERMS:

An application must be completed and signed on an annual basis, to enroll in the program. The application is to be mailed or delivered to the Village Hall, 9500 Belmont Avenue, Franklin Park, Illinois 60131, and Attention: Human Resources Department (the "Department").

- 1. The Department will review the application and accompanying documentation and determine if the applicant qualifies for the program.
- 2. The following service will be provided to an applicant upon completion of the application and approval by the Department:
 - Lawn will be cut as needed, as determined by the Village, weather permitting, but in no event will the lawn be cut more than once per week. Cutting will begin April 9, 2018, and continue through the last week of October.
 - Sidewalk will be power blown of excess grass clippings.
 - A monthly bill will be sent to you from the Village Comptroller's office. The charge is \$10.00 per cut. In the event payment is not received within thirty (30) days of the date of the invoice, the applicant hereby authorizes and agrees that the Village shall have the unilateral right to add the delinquent amount due to the water bill for the property and has the further right to disqualify the applicant and property from the program and discontinue future service.
- 3. The applicant agrees to the following:
 - The lawn <u>must</u> be free of all feces.
 - The program does not include:
 - a. Fertilizing the grass.
 - b. Edging.
 - c. Trimming the bushes, trees or other plants.
 - d. Watering the grass, plants, bushes, trees, etc.
 - e. Weed Whacking.

- 4. The applicant may withdraw from the program by providing the Department with written notice. Such notice shall include a specific withdrawal date which shall not be less than seven (7) days from the date the notice is received by the Village. The applicant shall pay the Village for any services rendered prior to the withdrawal date.
- 5. The Village may terminate, suspend or close the enrollment period for the program, at anytime.
- 6. The Village may limit the number of participants in the program. In such case, space in the program will be filled on a first come, first serve basis. Completed applications must be received by the Department.
- 7. The applicant hereby agrees to hold the Village, its officers, officials, employees and agents harmless for any damage or loss to the property, which arises directly or indirectly from the Village's grass cutting program.

I have read the guidelines and terms listed above and understand and agree to the program criteria, requirements and penalties and further expressly agree to hold the Village harmless for any damage to the property, as herein described.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1718-VC-

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3-2-13 OF CHAPTER TWO OF TITLE THREE OF THE VILLAGE CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN PARK, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS TO PROHIBIT CONVENTIONAL GAMBLING AND GAMES OF CHANCE

WHEREAS, the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park (the "Corporate Authorities") are charged with the responsibility of regulating the sale and distribution of alcoholic beverages within the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village's Local Liquor Control Commissioner has the authority to issue, suspend and revoke licenses, which authorize the sale and distribution of alcoholic beverages by individuals and entities within the Village (the "License"); and

WHEREAS, the Local Liquor Control Commissioner is charged with adopting procedures, rules and regulations for the licensing and operating of retail liquor establishments to: insure compliance with the laws relating to the sale of alcoholic liquor; protect the health, safety and welfare of the people of the Village; and foster and promote temperance in the consumption of alcoholic liquors; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that a person or entity operating a Licensed retail liquor establishment within the Village (the "Licensee") shall not be permitted to allow

any type of gambling or game of chance amusement devices, except as explicitly sanctioned in the Village Code of Franklin Park (the "Village Code"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find that it is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village to expressly disallow gambling and game of chance amusement devices within licensed premises within the Village subject to the terms and conditions herein contained and as provided in the Village Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

- Section 1. That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.
- Section 2. The Corporate Authorities hereby authorize the Local Liquor Control Commissioner to revoke the License of any Licensee found to have allowed game of chance amusement devices or gambling in violation of state law or the Village Code.
- Section 3. Section 3-2-13 ("Prohibited acts and conditions") of Chapter 2 ("Alcoholic Beverages") of Title 3 ("Business and License Regulations") of the Village Code of Franklin Park, Illinois, is hereby amended by adding new subsections (g) and (h) to read, as follows:
 - (g) Conventional gambling prohibited. There shall be no conventional gambling allowed on any premises licensed under this chapter. For purposes of this chapter, conventional gambling shall mean any and all gambling, including but not limited to cards, table games and sports betting; however, "video gaming" as defined by the Illinois Video Gaming Act 230 ILCS 40/1 et seq. and this code shall not be included in this definition.
 - (h) Game of chance amusement devices prohibited. There shall be no Game of Chance Amusement Device allowed on any premises, or portion thereof, licensed under this chapter. For purposes of this chapter, Game of Chance Amusement Device shall mean a machine or other device activated upon the insertion of cash, electronic cards,

coupons, electronic codes, or vouchers or any combination thereof for self-service use, which by application of the element of chance, may deliver or entitle the person playing or operating the device to receive cash, premiums, merchandise or tokens; this definition shall include, but not be limited to, machines or devices that offer games of skill or chance where money or other things of value can be won but no payment or purchase is required to participate. The definition of Game of Chance Amusement Device shall not include video gaming terminals licensed by the Illinois Gaming Board.

- **Section 4.** If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.
- **Section 5**. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- Section 6. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 7-8B-2 OF CHAPTER EIGHT OF TITLE SEVEN OF THE VILLAGE CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN PARK, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS ESTABLISHING WATER AND SEWER RATES

WHEREAS, the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park (the "Corporate Authorities") may from time to time amend the text of the Village Code of Franklin Park when it is determined to be in the best interests of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the City of Chicago (the "City") supplies the Village with water and increases the rates it will charge the Village for water each year; and

WHEREAS, in addition to City imposed water rate increases the Village must pay the City to purchase water for its residents, the Village must also pay for its expense to operate, repair, maintain and upgrade the water and sewer systems to service its residents; and

WHEREAS, because of rate increases by the City and need to repair the Village's aging and dilapidated infrastructure, the Village must ensure there are sufficient funds available to provide for the ongoing operation, repair and maintenance of the Village's waterworks and sewerage systems.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2. Section 7-8B-2 ("Rates Established") of Article B ("Service Charges") of Chapter 8 ("Water Systems") of Title 7 ("Public Works and Properties") of the Village Code of Franklin Park, Illinois, is hereby amended by deleting the following stricken language and adding the underlined language to read, as follows:

7-8B-2. - Rates Established.

(a) There are hereby established rates and charges for the use and services of the waterworks system of the village, as follows:

All users shall be charged at the rate of six dollars forty-four cents (\$6.44) seven dollars sixty-one cents (\$7.61) per one hundred (100) cubic feet of water used each month between zero cubic feet and nine hundred (900) cubic feet and shall be based upon the amount of water consumed as shown by the water meter, to be billed and paid monthly.

All users shall be charged at the rate of eight dollars three cents (\$8.03) nine dollars forty-nine cents (\$9.49) per one hundred (100) cubic feet of water used each month above nine hundred (900) cubic feet and shall be based upon the amount of water consumed as shown by the water meter, to be billed and paid monthly.

A minimum charge of thirteen dollars ten cents (\$13.10) fifteen dollars twenty-two cents per month shall be made.

On September 1, 2015, water rates herein established shall be automatically adjusted upward to reflect the percentile increase in the consumer pricing index for all urban consumers per the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics over the most ascertainable twelve (12) month period. Starting September 1, 2016 June 1, 2019, and each such every year thereafter, water rates herein established, including the minimum charge, shall be automatically adjusted upward by three percent (3%) to reflect the percentile increase in either the consumer pricing index for all urban consumers per the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics over the last ascertainable twelve (12) month period or and shall further be automatically adjusted upward by the applicable annual percentile increase in the rate of water charged to the village by the city of Chicago, whichever is greater. Every annual adjustment will be

administered by the village comptroller. The village comptroller shall be required to inform the village board in writing of said percentile increase prior to such increase taking effect.

Any disabled and low income user that qualifies under the low income home energy assistance program (LIHEAP) for their residence and who is receiving village water service is eligible to receive a reduced rate by providing proof of LIHEAP eligibility to the village comptroller. The monthly reduced rate shall be twenty-five (25) percent of the monthly bill and must be renewed on a yearly basis. The village comptroller is authorized to establish eligibility criteria and rules for the disabled and low income reduced fee. The village comptroller may also identify a different standard by which a disabled and low income user shall qualify for assistance but only after presenting such standard to the village board for approval before implementation.

(b) There are hereby established rates and charges for the use and services of the sewerage system of the village, as follows:

All users shall be charged at the rate of three dollars eighty six cents (\$3.86) four dollars fifty-seven cents (\$4.57) per one hundred (100) cubic feet of water used as shown by the water meter between zero cubic feet and nine hundred (900) cubic feet, to be billed and paid monthly.

All users shall be charged at the rate of four dollars eighty-one cents (\$4.81) five dollars sixty-nine cents (\$5.69) per one hundred (100) cubic feet of water used as shown by the water meter above nine hundred (900) cubic feet, to be billed and paid monthly.

A minimum charge of seven dollars eighty six cents (\$7.86) nine dollars fourteen cents shall be made.

On September 1, 2015, sewer rates herein established shall be automatically adjusted upward to reflect the percentile increase in the consumer pricing index for all urban consumers per the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics over the most ascertainable twelve (12) month period. Starting September 1, 2016 June 1, 2019, and each such every year thereafter, sewer rates herein established, including the minimum charge, shall be automatically adjusted upward by three percent (3%) to reflect the percentile increase in either the consumer pricing index for all urban consumers per the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics over the most ascertainable twelve (12) month period or and shall further be automatically adjusted upward by the applicable annual percentile increase in the rate of water charged to the village by the city of Chicago, whichever is greater. Every annual adjustment will be administered by the village comptroller. The village comptroller shall be required to inform the village board in writing of said percentile increase prior to such

increase taking effect.

Any disabled and low income user that qualifies under the low income home energy assistance program (LIHEAP) for their residence and who is receiving village water service is eligible to receive a reduced rate by providing proof of LIHEAP eligibility to the village comptroller. The monthly reduced rate shall be twenty-five (25) percent of the monthly bill and must be renewed on a yearly basis. The village comptroller is authorized to establish eligibility criteria and rules for the disabled and low income reduced fee. The village comptroller may also identify a different standard by which a disabled and low income user shall qualify for assistance but only after presenting such standard to the village board for approval before implementation.

Where sewer service is furnished, but not water, or where sewerage is discharged into a sewer, and the source of the water being supplied to the user is other than the village, then the rate charged shall be four dollars eighty one cents (\$4.81) five dollars sixty-nine cents (\$5.69) per one hundred (100) cubic feet of water used, as determined by statement of the water supplier or by estimate of the commissioner, whose determination of such estimate shall be binding upon the user.

. . .

- Section 3. The amendments set forth in Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be used to calculate water and sewer usage for the next billing cycle, effective March 1, 2018, and thereafter, as shown by the water meter and to be billed and paid monthly.
- **Section 4**. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.
- Section 5. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- Section 6. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval so that sufficient funds are available to the Village for the purchase of water and to provide such necessary funds to ensure that the waterworks and sewerage systems of the Village are operated, repaired and maintained at a level to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN PARK, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS ESTABLISHING SALARY SCHEDULES AND OTHER COMPENSATION

WHEREAS, the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois (the "Village") is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. That the above recital is found to be true and correct and is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in its entirety.

Section 2. That the officers and employees of the Village, as herein provided, shall be paid in accordance with the following schedule for the period of May 1, 2017 to April 30, 2018, and as subsequently calculated as herein provided, or until such further action by the Board of Trustees. Except where indicated otherwise, the amounts set forth opposite the position are stated in terms on an annual basis. For exempt employees, the amount indicated as an annual amount is the upper limit of compensation to be paid. For payroll adjustment purposes, the computation of payment based on hourly amounts for non-salaried employees where an annual amount of compensation has been provided appears after the annual statement in parentheses. The stated amount is used for computation for a given pay period. The salary schedule for Village employees and officers is as follows:

Collective Bargaining Units:

Section 3(A). All non-union employees, officers and officials are eligible to participate in the Village employees' hospitalization, dental, short and long term disability insurance programs. Non-union employees shall be eligible for single and/or dependent coverage at their option. Elected officials shall only be eligible for single coverage, but the Village President shall be eligible for dependant coverage, commencing with the new term of office following the election in April 2009, provided the Village President performs as a full-time Village President. With respect to non-union employees, the Village Comptroller is hereby directed to retain from payment of wages an amount equal to twenty percent (20%) of the health and dental insurance premiums assessable to the employee under the health and dental insurance program as elected by the employee. Such retained amounts shall be co-payments by the employee for participation in the Village's health insurance plan and program. The compensation of all elected officials elected on or after April 1, 2003 shall include 100% of the premium for single coverage under the Village's group health insurance plan to be paid by the Village, for those elected officials who elect coverage; and after the election in April 2009, 80% of the premium for dependent coverage for the Village President, to be paid by the Village, if the Village President so elects said coverage.

Section 3(B). Non-union employees are hereby authorized to accumulate sick days. Upon retirement, these sick days, if sufficient, can be used to purchase up to one additional year of service under the Village's retirement plan (Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund – IMRF).

Section 3(C). That for purposes of determining the time of service to be eligible for progressing in steps where steps are provided for determining the salaries and other compensation involved in a position, the time of service is based solely upon active duty service, the progression from steps being determined as a function of experience on the job, and absence from active duty shall not be included in calculation of service salary purposes.

Section 4. Salary Schedule Relationship to New Employee; Employees at New Position, and Periodic Review/ Evaluation of Employees.

The scheduled amount of compensation set forth in this Ordinance to the extent applied to positions other than those of officers and department heads or positions for which compensation is provided by other current ordinance of the Village other than the Appropriation Ordinance and the Tax Levy Ordinance or by contract, may be reduced or increased as to a particular position under the circumstance and in the manner as provided in this Section.

- In the event that a new employee is being hired to fill a vacant or new position, the employee shall be hired in an amount not to exceed the then current amount as provided for the position in this Ordinance. The amount of entry level compensation shall be recommended by the appropriate department head or supervisor and the Village Comptroller shall report the recommendation to the Board of Trustees for approval. All such recommendations shall be confidential and shall be based on the person's experience, skills, this Ordinance, the available funds remaining in the appropriations for the department or program involved, and such other matters deemed relevant by the person submitting the recommendation. Every new employee affected by the provision of this paragraph may be hired through a probationary status pending approval of salary amount as may be necessary by the Board of Trustees. Failure by the Board of Trustees to act on the recommendation within ninety (90) days of its submittal will constitute approval of the recommendation as submitted by the Village Comptroller.
- In the event that a current employee is being transferred to fill a vacant or new position, that employee shall be paid no more than the amount set opposite the position that is being filled as provided in this Ordinance. In the event that an adjustment to the amount of compensation is deemed appropriate by the department head or immediate supervisor and the Village Comptroller, then the procedures as set forth in Paragraph (1) of this section shall be followed.
- In the event that department head or supervisor of employees determines that the amount of compensation, after review and evaluation of the performance of an employee, is inappropriate and should be adjusted either upward or downward, then such person may prepare a written recommendation stating the reasons, in support of the recommended adjustment and the specific circumstances which occasioned review and evaluation of the employee's performance and a projection of the expected results that may be reasonably associated with the adjustment as they relate to performance and morale within the department affected and as to the individual employee. The recommendation shall be filed with the Village Comptroller who shall review it to determine whether the funds available by appropriation to the department are sufficient given the recommended adjustment. After review for that purpose, the Village Comptroller shall file, or cause to be

filed, the recommendation with the Board of Trustees. No adjustment in the amount shall occur absent confirmation by the Village Comptroller as to the sufficiency of funds appropriated for such purposes and approval by the Board of Trustees.

- Section 5. The wages and salaries provided for herein shall apply and be paid only to those employees and officers duly appointed and qualified to hold such position or presently employed and whose employment is in good standing as of the date of this Ordinance and shall be in full force and effective as set forth herein retroactive to May 1, 2017, and shall be paid when funds become available for such purpose. Elected Officials shall not receive an increase in annual salary.
- **Section 6.** Any existing positions for which salaries are not stated or provided in this Ordinance shall continue to be compensated at the level of salary as last approved by the Board of Trustees for such positions except in the event of termination of the position or of the employee or reduction in compensation at which time this authorization shall cease.
- **Section 7**. All positions listed above that have an * (asterisks) following the position are hereby designated as exempt employees and as such shall be considered salaried employees and not eligible for overtime compensation.
- Section 8. This Ordinance, and its parts, are declared to be severable and any section, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance that is declared invalid shall not affect the validity of any other provision of this Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.
- Section 9. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- Section 10. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval to ensure that public services are maintained and the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village is duly protected.

WHEREAS, a tower commonly known as the B-12 Tower (the "*B-12 Tower*") is located on the Property; and

WHEREAS, RailStream, LLC, a Michigan limited liability company, 3800 Syckelmoore Street, Trenton, Michigan (the "RailStream"), has proposed to lease portions of the exterior and interior of the B-12 Tower and a Village-owned light pole located on the Property and adjacent to the B-12 Tower (the "Premises") pursuant to a Railcam Lease Agreement by and between the Village of Franklin Park and RailStream, LLC (the "Lease"), a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A, in accordance with the terms and conditions therein specified; and

WHEREAS, the Village President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park (the "Corporate Authorities") have determined that it is in the best interest of the health, safety and

welfare of its residents to lease the Premises to RailStream in order to allow RailStream to install, maintain, and operate certain equipment on the Premises for use in RailStream's internet livestreaming business.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Franklin Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

- Section 1. That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.
- Section 2.
