 - 1. MR. JOHNSON ANNOUNCED THERE WILL BE A FINANCE MEETING SOME TIME IN FEBRUARY
 - 2. MR. JOHNSON REPORTED ON THE ABATEMENT OF TAXES
 - B. WATER AND SEWER/FLEET MAINTENANCE COMMITTEE (Mr. Caporusso, Chair)
 - 1. MR. CAPORUSSO STATED THE WATER DEPARTMENT HAS BEEN EXTREMELY BUSY. ONE WATER MAIN VALVE WAS FIXED AT THE JACK B. WILLIAMS RETENTION POND AND THERE WERE SIX WATER MAIN BREAKS THROUGHOUT TOWN
 - 2. MR. CAPORUSSO STATED THE SEWER DIVISION HAS BEEN BUSY RODDING OUT 4,122 FEET OF SEWER LINE

 - 3. MR. RUHL STATED THE FIRE DEPARTMENT RECEIVED A \$10,000 GRANT FOR THE STRETCHER LIFT SYSTEM FOR THE NEW AMBULANCE. THE FIRE DEPARTMENT RECENTLY APPLIED FOR A \$900,000 GRANT FOR A NEW LADDER TRUCK

 - 6. MR. RUHL ANNOUNCED CHIEF MIKE WITZ IS RETIRING FROM THE FRANKLIN PARK POLICE DEPARTMENT JANUARY 20
