VI. STAFF REPORTS AND COMMENTS; DISCUSSION ON AGENDA ITEMS

- 1. John Schneider spoke on agenda item #7 regarding amending sections of the zoning code relating to the regulation of pavement, restaurants and storage containers. In regards to pavement, Mr. Schneider reported in 2005, the Village board basically passed an ordinance to pave all unpaved surfaces in the industrial area. In 2011, the Village board decided to hold off and wait to review this. In 2014, the Village board decided to move forward. An analysis was done with other communities and the Village. Mr. Schneider met with the Building Department, Fire Department, and Engineering. The Village has decided if there is a change in use, sale of property or a change in lease, this regulation takes place and the owner would have to pave their unpaved services. Regarding restaurants, Mr. Schneider explained all restaurants currently go for conditional use. This ordinance would now have restaurants go to the Zoning Administrator for review and then go through the normal process for occupancy. The only thing that would still go to the Zoning Board of Appeals is drive-up restaurants. Regarding storage containers, Mr. Schneider explained there are storage containers located in almost all of the zoning districts. This ordinance changes this. The reason for this is because on some storage container sites, it reduces the amount of parking spaces available, reduces the amount of the permeability of the soil, and they create no taxes for the Village. They also endanger the firefighters' lives because when they go out there, they don't know what is being stored in these containers. In I-1 districts, you will now only be allowed one storage container and in I-2 districts, you will be allowed two. In other districts, they will not be allowed in the future. The storage containers will be tagged, permitted, and be inspected every year by the Fire Department. If storage containers are currently there, they will not be required to be removed. These three zoning code item changes were unanimously approved by the Zoning Board of Appeals
- 2. Joe Lauro spoke about the liquid brine application used on the roads. Mr. Lauro attended seminars in the summer regarding this cost-saving program. Mr. Lauro spoke about meeting the past couple of months with a company called, "Alternative Fuel" for propane use. There is no cost to the Village. Mr. Lauro is looking for a grant for alternative fuel
- 3. Carmen Cupello thanked the board for allowing the hiring of a new inspector to help with inspections. Mr. Cupello spoke about temporary occupancies and how his department is focusing on life-saving issues such as smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors, and exit signs. Mr. Cupello stated people are not calling back to have re-inspections for these items. Mr. Cupello does not want to issue temporary occupancies until these items are corrected and a re-inspection has been performed. This would also apply to the sale of a home. Mr. Cupello spoke about Springbrook training within his department
