Mr. Schneider spoke about Cook County looking at the Village's request for low-interest financing for the Cullerton Avenue special service area. Mr. Schneider introduced Nicole Woods from CMAP
- 2. Nicole Woods from CMAP gave a presentation on the O'Hare Industrial Corridor Plan
